

The skateboard accident







He / she / it, the "s" must fit!

Do I / you / we / they drink water? Does he / she / it drink water?

Attention! Not: Does he / she / it drinks water?

But: drink

I / you / we / they don't drink water. He / she / it doesn't drink water.

Attention! Not: He / she / it doesn't drinks water.

But: drink




